Non-Qualifying Expense List

Effective August 18, 2026

Devices

- 3D printers in excess of \$300 (one per household)
- Accessories and cases for electronics unless explicitly included with an approved product
- CD/Cassette players
- Cell phones
- Digital picture frames or calendars (Skylight, Cozyla, Aura, and similar devices)
- Explicit or obscene material
- Home theater or audio equipment
- Internet service fees
- Phone service fees
- Record players
- Smart home devices
- Smartwatches
- Streaming devices
- Television
- Video game console or accessory

Food and dining

- Food including animal feed/food
- Lunch boxes and water bottles
- Paper goods for lunches – Ziploc bags, paper towels, wet wipes
- Ready-to-eat subscription boxes

Home

- Cookware or appliances including pots and pans, utensils, cauldrons, dehydrators, freeze-dryers, espresso machines, grain mills, ovens, smokers, BBQ grills, fire pits, popcorn makers, vacuum sealers, pizza ovens, rest mats
- Games and board games that do not have a purely educational focus (e.g. playing cards, board games, trading cards)
- General home furnishings and non-instructional furniture or fixtures; includes gaming chairs
- Household cleaning supplies
- Large appliances (e.g. stoves, refrigerators, freezers)
- Pet accessories or bedding
- Play or climbing structures, indoor or outdoor, unless clinician-required
- Pool tables
- Toys without an explicit educational purpose
- Utilities or other home maintenance expenses

Fees, subscriptions, services, and gift cards

- Amazon Prime fees or similar
- Assembly or installation fees
- Before- and after-school care
- Consulting services, training, assistance, or advice provided to a student's parent, account holder, or other person
- Day care fees
- Entertainment streaming services such as Netflix, Hulu, HBO, Amazon Prime, etc.
- Fundraising fees
- Gift cards of any kind
- Hotels and lodging
- Insurance plans of any kind
- Late or returned payment fees
- Lifetime subscriptions or memberships
- Magazine subscriptions that do not have an educational focus (e.g. Country Living, Vogue, Horse and Hound)
- Maintenance/protection/storage plans for devices or electronics (e.g. Apple Care, Amazon warranty services, cloud storage services, etc.)
- Movie and theater tickets
- Non-educational fees charged by schools and service providers for parking passes, yearbooks, picture day packages, caps and gowns, spirit day participation, school fundraising requirements, parent teacher association participation, and other similar fees
- Overnight camps
- Parent training courses unless related to a documented need for a student with special needs
- Plane, train, or bus passes that are not transportation to and from a qualifying school or provider
- Season tickets or subscriptions to entertainment venues
- Summer or holiday camps which are not primarily academic or instructional (e.g. recreation camps, camps without a structured educational curriculum)
- Theme/amusement park tickets, memberships, and subscriptions
- Tickets to sporting events
- Travel costs for teachers and tutors

Outdoor

- All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) or Go Karts
- Bikes including balance bikes unless clinician-required
- Bounce houses or water slides
- Dog training
- Fencing or livestock containment structures
- Firearms and firearm accessories
- Fuel, oil, and chemicals except chemicals required by educational curricula, such as science curricula
- Greenhouse larger than modest instructional size (one per household)
- Hoverboards, roller skates, skateboards, and scooters unless clinician-required
- Landscaping materials and equipment such as lawn mowers, trimmers and edgers, leaf blowers, pressure washers, chain saws, hedge trimmers, rototillers and cultivators, pole saws, wood chippers, generators
- Large chicken coops or runs (one per household)
- Live animals or livestock except for a documented educational purpose
- Motorized vehicle
- Outdoor playground equipment and play sets
- Outdoor shade structures
- Pets
- Punching bags
- Recreational equipment of any kind not tied to curriculum
- Swimming pools, saunas, and ponds
- Tents
- Trailers of any kind
- Trampolines
- Trees or shrubbery
- Two-way radios
- Weapons and ammunition, including BB guns, air soft guns, and paintball guns (archery bows with a draw weight less than 35 lbs. are allowable as part of archery instruction)

Personal items

- Bedding
- Children's car seats
- Footwear
- Jewelry including analog watches and precious metals
- Medical services, devices, and supplies not tied to qualifying disability services
- Medications, vitamins, and supplements
- Non-uniform clothing
- Performance costumes (e.g. dance recitals)
- Personal bag (e.g. backpack, laptop bag, purse)
